Sub:- Implementation of Janani Shishu Suraksha Karyakram Yojna (JSSK) in the districts-
release of funds thereof.

Sir,

Govt. order No. 516-HME of 2011 dated 24-09-2011 was issued regarding exemption of user charges and free entitlements to all pregnant women delivering in Public Health institutions and sick neonates upto 30 days with zero out of pocket expenses under "Janani Shishu Suraksha Karyakram" (JSSK) along with following entitlements :-

1. Entitlement for Pregnant women:-

- a) Free and zero expenses delivery.
- b) Free caesarean section.
- c) Free drugs and consumables.
- d) Free diagnostic (Blood, Urine tests and Ultra Sonography etc.).
- e) Free diet during stay (up to 3 days for normal delivery and 7 days for caesarean section).
- f) Free provision of Blood (on replacement basis).
- g) Free transport from home to health institution, between health institution in case of referrals and drop back home.
- h) Exemption from all kind of user charges.

2. Entitlement for sick New borns till 30 days after birth:-

- a) Free and zero expense treatment.
- b) Free drugs and consumables.
- c) Free diagnostics.
- d) Free provision of blood (On replacement basis).
- e) Free transport from home to health institution, between health institution in case of referrals and drop back home.
- f) Exemption from all kind of user charges.

In view of the Government Order, District-wise targets and its financial implication has been worked out as per approved norms and guidelines of Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, GoI.

The proposal with regard to release of additional funds under this programme is pending with the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, GoI and is likely to be received by the state shortly, till that time the MOH& FW has desired that State should meet the expenses on this account out of available funds under Base Flexipool.

The funds on account of Free Drugs and Consumables for Pregnant women and sick neonates as per following details are being released to the following District Health Societies. However expenditure for other activities under this programme be met out of available funds released for Base Flexipool.

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You are, therefore, requested to release the above sanctioned funds/allow the Block Medical Officers and down below to utilize the unspent balances under Base Flexipool towards the approved activities of the above programme.

The Grant-in- Aid released is subject to following terms and conditions:

1. Establishment of centralized Call centre alongwith toll free number is a mandatory requirement for providing referral Transport services to the pregnant women and neonates and Expression of interest for its establishment has already been issued by the Director Health Services.
2. Instead of flat reimbursement @ Rs. 1000/- under free transport it should be differential as per the location of the facilities and the distance covered in case it is PPP mode.
3. All purchases are to be made after observing all codal formalities required under rules.
4. Cash reimbursement to the beneficiaries for referral transport is not permissible.
5. Full justification of referral and type of complication is recorded both at primary and tertiary centre. Referral in and referral out registers be maintained in all the delivery points.
6. Proper record of drugs and consumables issued to beneficiary be maintained. The list of essential drugs specified by MOH&FW, Govt are annexed herewith as "B" and its availability is ensured at every health facilities. No cash re-imburement is allowed.
7. Healthy Diet to the pregnant women is provided as per permissibility under the close supervision of the Head of the Institution and proper record is maintained. No cash reimbursement is allowed.
8. The funds sanctioned are utilized strictly as per the Budget Sheets enclosed and guidelines issued by the State Health Society that too after observing all codal formalities required under rules.
9. The District Health Society shall follow all the financial management system under NRHM and shall submit monthly FMR, Quarterly summary of Concurrent audit and monthly Statement of fund position as per formats already provided.
10. The Physical achievements are sent to State Health Society regularly.
11. Proper record of cash books, ledgers complete address of beneficiaries and other relevant record is maintained at all levels for check of any visiting team from Central/ State Government.
12. The account of the District Health Society shall be open to the inspection by the sanctioning authority and Audit both by the Comptroller and Auditor General of India under the provision of CAG (DPC) Act 1971 and internal Audit by Principal Accounts Office of the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. Whenever the society is called upon to do so.
